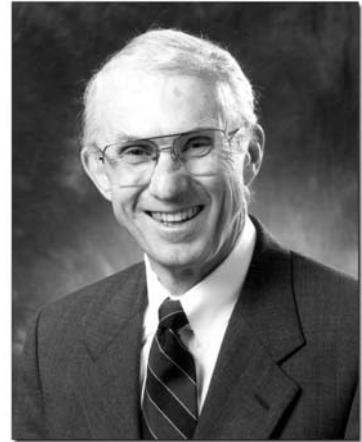


Harris Memorial Award Presented to Dr. Estes in 2004

E. Harvey Estes, Jr., MD, emeritus professor of community and family medicine at Duke University, was presented with the distinguished T. Reginald Harris, MD, Award on November 13, 2004, in conjunction with the fall meeting of the North Carolina Medical Society. The award, created by The Carolinas Center for Medical Excellence, formerly Medical Review of North Carolina, Inc., honors the life and memory of T. Reginald Harris, MD, one of its founding members.

Dr. Estes, the sixth physician to receive the Award, received his medical degree from Emory University in Atlanta, Ga. He completed his residency at Duke University after two years of active duty in the Navy during the Korean conflict. He became a professor of medicine at Duke in 1961. In 1966, he was asked to chair the new Department of Community and Family Medicine, which trained family physicians and physician assistants and sponsored programs in occupational medicine and informatics.

After retiring from Duke, Dr. Estes became the director of the North Carolina Medical Society Foundation's Kate B. Reynolds Community Practitioner Program, which places primary care practitioners in underserved areas in North Carolina. He retired from this position in 1998.
